Why We're Here

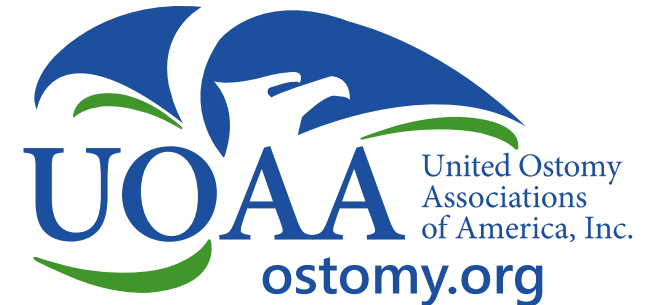
